The flowers were ordered in October, 56 flats, and planted in early November. It takes more than 30 volunteers to plant all of the flowers and then deadhead and pull weeds throughout the season. We are fortunate to have these hard working residents to help keep our park looking good.

We had a meeting in November and came up with some recommendations for Dell.

1. Use the information from the co-operative Extension for planting the rye grass so we don't have the same problems that we had this season. I have been assured by Dell that the proper steps will be followed. We were pleased that a new landscaper has been hired, Gary Cantrell. He has been working on our sprinkler systems, to get them back in working order.
2. We would like to see the trimming of the Oleander and Ruellia done so that they have a more natural look with flowers when we come down for the winter. Some of the other perennials also need to be trimmed in the spring or summer so they don't get so overgrown.
3. Weeds are another problem and the landscape crew has been working to get rid of them.
4. Some of the beds that used to have flowers are in need of landscaping. We have added some large rocks and more landscape rock will be added this spring or summer to give the area a better look.

We will continue to work with Dell to try to keep our park landscape looking good throughout the season.
